Blessed Sacrament Parish Christian Service Funding Grant Awards 2025

The Christian Service Funding Committee is comprised of Blessed Sacrament Parishioners that meet and thoroughly review all the applications that are submitted. The committee decides which organizations will receive funding and the award amount. The funding is from our weekend collection tithe. At the end of each month, the Sunday Collections are totaled and 10% is set aside as our parish tithe. The tithe is used for Christian Service Funding Grants and Emergency Assistance Funding. Emergency Assistance addresses more immediate needs of people within our community for rent, utilities and car repairs. Blessed Sacrament Parish has been awarding Funding Grants since 1981 (over 40 years!) totaling more than \$3 million dollars. Below are the 53 groups that are being funded for 2025.

A Catholic Relief Services (CRS) program has created Savings and Internal Lending Communities (SILCs) to address this lack by helping poor communities to pool savings, which then can be lent to SILC members to build or grow businesses at low cost. In Chad, Claudine, a mother of six, uses loans from her local SILC to buy large, lower-cost quantities of the ingredients she needs to make the beignets she sells at market. Before the SILC was established, Claudine was barely able to sell enough beignets to live. But now these cost savings allow her to care for her family and pay school fees.

En Chad, Claudine, una madre de seis niños, utiliza el préstamo de su SILC local para comprar a bajo costo grandes cantidades de los ingredientes necesarios para elaborar los buñuelos que ella vende en el mercado. Antes de que se estableciera SILC, Claudine apenas podía vender suficientes buñuelos para poder subsistir. Pero ahora, estos ahorros en los costos le permiten mantener a su familia y cubrir las matrículas escolares.
