FEBRUARY 2025 MISSION TRIP

Stove Part Delivery

HELPS International managed the delivery of the stove and water filter parts to the communities before we arrived. The families have to carry their stove pieces long distances down rugged paths to their homes. They are willing because of the major benefits, the venting of the smoke outside, 70% reduction in firewood consumed, and reduced risk of burns.



Area Served

With support from **you**, our generous family of donors, this year's Guatemala Stove Team, made up of 21 U.S. volunteers, installed stoves and water filters in 161 homes. We served families in San Pablo Xucaneb, Cobán, and sectors of El Manantial, and Tactic, as well as a school in San Pablo Xucaneb, all in the department of Alta Verapaz. Seven sub-teams were accompanied by a translator and a community guide. Even the two bus drivers helped with the installations.

The homes are typically basic wood boards for the walls, a steel lamina roof, and a dirt floor.

San Pablo Xucaneb School

There are eight classrooms at the San Pablo Xucaneb school. We provided a water filter for each classroom. Not enough rain water was available in the cistern for sanitizing the water filters, so each child was asked to bring a container of water to the school. One of our volunteers donated bags of much appreciated sports equipment to the school.



Guatemala is a stunningly beautiful country, with a mountainous region in the north where we visit. Broccoli is growing on the hill behind the children at the school.



An important part of our visit is to connect with the families and hopefully leave a lasting impression of our care and respect for them.

Climbs and Elevation

We managed some steep climbs on muddy and slippery trails, but fortunately without any serious falls. The elevation in this area was around 6500'. Because the coaster buses couldn't navigate some of the roads, we needed trucks to reach a few homes. The families made the same climbs with all of the heavy stove pieces.







Water Filter



The water supply is rain water caught in a cistern or diverted from a stream, leaving families at risk of pathogens. This is why the water filter is so vital.

Mayan Culture

Weaving is a special part of the Mayan culture. Maya women document and preserve stories and culture in their textiles. The patterns and colors vary by communities.
